Hillington Church has stood in our village as a place of worship for hundreds of years, but, like many of us, it's feeling its age. Time doesn't stand still, and, indeed, many generations before us have undertaken major restoration work to make the building fit for purpose. For example, exactly 200 years ago, the nave was rebuilt and the south aisle absorbed into it. The pews were given to the church after the First World War. About 100 years ago, a 14th century font from a redundant village church replaced the plain, 19th century one.

The Parochial Church Council is considering how best to ensure that the church building meets the needs of its worshippers and supports the village generally. What should our priorities be? What do you want from your church? How could you support your church?
